

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF INSTALLATION


The priest who is promoted to exercise the pastoral care of a parish obtains this care and is bound to exercise it from the moment he takes possession.

A parish is a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within the diocese; it normally embraces all those within a certain nationality.

The liturgical part of taking possession has significance in the life of a parish. It draws the attention of the faithful to the various aspects of sacramental life and to the tasks of the Pastor as teacher, sanctifier, as well as governor. Not only is the Letter of Appointment read and the Profession of Faith recited, but also the Pastor is formally introduced to the places which will be hallowed by his ministry. Through it the faithful see the installation of their own shepherd who is the co-worker with the order of bishops under the authority of the diocesan Bishop.

Pastors are obliged to see to it that the Word of God in its entirety is announced and that the faithful are nourished through a devout celebration of the sacraments so that the Most Holy Eucharist is the centre of the parish assembly.

The installation of a new Pastor is done by the diocesan Bishop himself or his delegate. The Bishop is to preside at the Mass, the new Pastor and other priests of the same parish or district concelebrating.



Municipal Elections 2022 – Cast Your Vote!

A municipal election will be held on Monday, October 24, 2022. All Catholics are strongly encouraged to exercise their democratic right to vote. To help learn more about the candidates for Catholic School Board Trustee, Cardinal Collins has given permission for these candidates to distribute literature to parishioners departing Mass on weekends from October 1/2 through October 22/23.

We hope you'll take the time to get to know those seeking elected office for this important role. To ensure your vote for Catholic School Board Trustee, at the polling booth, verify that you are registered as a separate school supporter. If your support status is incorrect ask for an Application to Amend Voters' List. This form may be completed and submitted at the polling station.
