The Feast of the Santo Niño, celebrated yearly on the third Sunday of January, is marked by joyful devotion throughout the Philippines, especially in Cebu, expressing the deep faith of Filipinos in the Holy Child Jesus. The revered image in the Basilica of Santo Niño de Cebu, the country's oldest Christian icon, was given to Queen Juana by Ferdinand Magellan's expedition at her baptism, as recorded by Antonio Pigafetta.

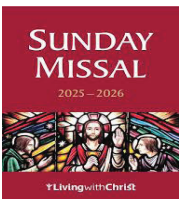
Did you know St. Pope John Paul II was made an honorary Harlem Globetrotter?

Did you know St. Jerome healed a lion's wounded paw, after which the grateful animal lives peacefully in the monastery guarded a donkey used for work. When merchants stole the donkey, the lion recovered it. In addition the thieves would repent and pledge yearly gifts to the monastery.



The Jewish feasts were central to Israel's faith, especially Passover, which commemorated God's deliverance of His people from slavery through the sacrifice of an unblemished lamb whose blood brought protection and life. Along with Passover, the Feast of Weeks and the Feast of Tabernacles recalled God's gift of the Law, His providence in the desert, and His ongoing covenantal care. Through these celebrations, as well as daily temple sacrifices and the prophecy of the Suffering Servant in Isaiah, the Jewish people became deeply familiar with the image of the lamb as a sign of sacrifice, redemption, and the forgiveness of sins.

Within this context, John the Baptist's declaration, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world," would have powerfully resonated with his disciples, who regarded him as a true prophet preparing the way for the Messiah. His words pointed to Jesus as the fulfillment of Passover, prophecy, and sacrifice, stirring excitement, hope, and awe among those who heard him. Today, as the Church enters Ordinary Time after the Christmas season, this same proclamation invites us to encounter Jesus' public ministry with renewed faith and anticipation. Like John's disciples, we are called to see Christ with fresh eyes, follow Him without reserve, and allow the Lamb of God to take away our sins and renew His work in our lives. *(summarized from mycatholiclife)*

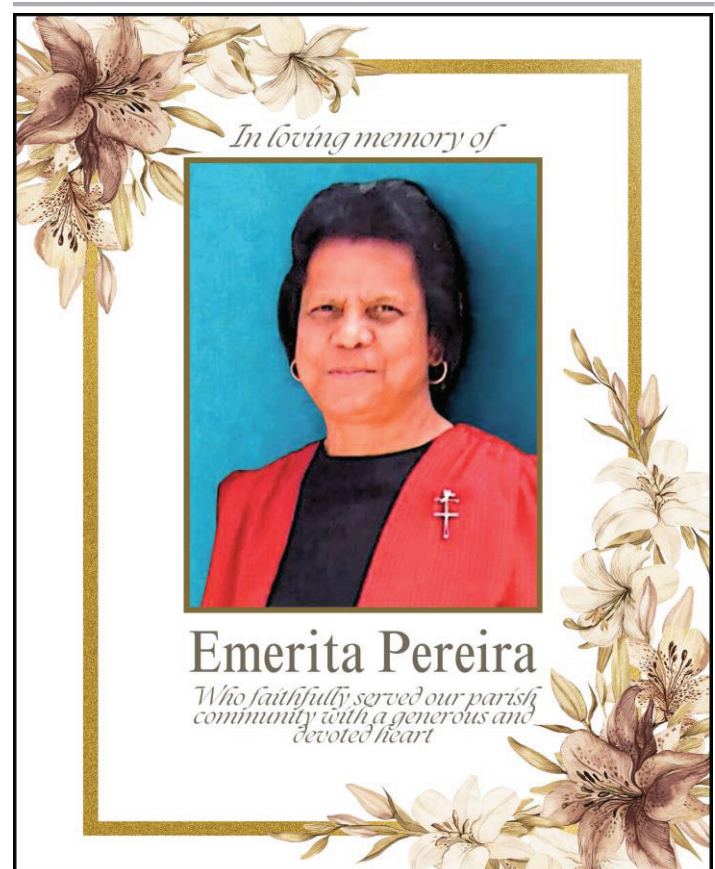
